Y3/4 Homework Menu for Summer 2

For this final half term, we will be continuing with our topic of the Second World War. Therefore, you may complete any tasks from the previous menu. However, because this is a World Cup year, we thought you might like to choose from some activities with this as the theme! If you don't like football, we've included some alternatives. If you want to try one of the maths challenges, collect one from your teacher. A reminder, please, that we are looking for one activity per week.

 1- Read, and review, a biography of a famous footballer (if you don't like football, choose a biography of another famous person) 	2- Ask a grown-up who likes football about their favourite memory of watching England play. Maybe they remember a game on television or the radio, or perhaps they were even at the game! Who played? Which country were they playing? What was the score? If you want, you could choose a different historical event.	3- Write a story in which you get called up to play for England, and are taken to the World Cup (or if you don't like football, imagine a different sport).
4- Choose one of the countries from this year's World Cup (not England) and find out about their team. Who are their star players? Who did they beat to qualify for the tournament? What is their kit like? (If you don't like football, you could just research one of the countries)	5- Did you know that England have won the World Cup? Find out about this. Who did they beat? Who scored? Perhaps you could write a newspaper report about it? Alternatively, you could write about a sporting event of your own choice.	6- Imagine you have been asked to re-design the England football kit (or another sport if you prefer). What would it look like? What would feature on the badge? Explain your choices of colour, material, logo, etc.
7- Write a World Cup acrostic poem (where the word is written down the side of the page). You could use the words 'World Cup, the word 'football', or the name of a country.	8- Do you like the program Jamie Johnson? Imagine you've been asked to write a new storyline. What might happen? Could you turn part of it into a script? Choose a different program if you don't like football.	 9- Find out about the role of someone who is involved with a football team but isn't a player. What does their job involve? Here are some ideas: manager, coach, physio, dietician, sports psychologist, kit manager
