Understand place value by partitioning two digit numbers. Identify 2D shapes and their properties. Describe position, direction and movement. Measure length and mass with greater accuracy. Read an analogue clock to the nearest five minutes.</p>		<p>Consolidate and learn phonic patterns to use in reading and writing. Learn, tell, write and re-create stories with familiar patterns.
