

Sports Premium Funding



Purpose

The government has provided additional funding of £150 million per annum for three years to improve the provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding is provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

Marlcliffe Primary School has been allocated £10,050. This will be spent to improve the quality of teaching and learning in physical education. We will monitor the impact this additional funding has to our PE curriculum delivery, the attainment of pupils and the levels of participation in sport.

Allocation and Use at Marlcliffe Primary

2014 – 2015 - £10,050

- To develop the Physical Education curriculum throughout the whole school. Install an Interactive Whiteboard and Projector in the Infant Hall, keeping children engaged and maintaining high levels of staff motivation when delivering the exciting new resources (i-Dance and Real PE). £3000
- To use supply cover to enable the PE subject leader and other teaching staff opportunities to attend training courses. This will support professional development, impacting on the confidence and competence of all staff. High levels of teaching, knowledge, and understanding in physical education will be delivered to all pupils. £650
- Release time for the P.E. Co-ordinator to observe physical education lessons, assess teaching and learning across the school and identify teachers who need additional support to improve to ensure that consistently good to outstanding lessons are being delivered. £350
- New equipment to be bought for all areas of physical education, particularly gymnastics equipment and for use across the whole school. £3000
- Healthy Schools Week. To engage all children in a healthy, fun week. Including physical activities, learning how to stay healthy, food technology, personal hygiene. £500
- Outdoor equipment. To replenish outdoor equipment for playtime and lunchtime activities, engaging children in safe, fun, physical activity. £500
- To participate in the change for life campaign, encourage all children to engage in physical activity and develop healthy life styles. £500
- To run an after-school Change for Life Club targeting specific children/families.
- Release time for staff to supervise children competing in events held by the Arches Sports Partnership and the Sainsbury's School Games, encouraging competition against other schools both locally and nationally. £350
- To purchase new resources for Foundation Stage to develop balance and co-ordination skills through our outdoor provision. £250
- To buy in sports coaches with specialist knowledge to deliver high quality P.E. to children and team teach with staff, increasing their subject knowledge and confidence to then deliver good and outstanding lessons. £1000
- To run a multi-sports after school club for Y5/6 pupil premium children who monitoring indicated did not usually attend clubs. £600

What we hope the Impact of School Sports Premium will be:

- The quality of teaching and learning will be increased throughout the whole school.
- Teaching resources and lesson plans will be significantly increased allowing a more varied range of activities being taught.
- The variety of equipment will be increased allowing a wider range of sports to be delivered to children.
- All children will engage in exciting physical education lessons and have further opportunities to gain a wider knowledge of how to maintain a healthy lifestyle both now and in the future.
- The school will continue to take part in a wide range of competitive sports events with local schools and all children will have the opportunity to take part in one in KS2.
- A wider range of after-school sports clubs will be offered and wider participation will be encouraged at these.
