Pupil Premium

Purpose

'The Government believes that the Pupil Premium which is additional to main school funding is the best way to address the current underlying inequalities between children eligible for free school meals (FSM) and their wealthier peers by ensuring that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who need it most'.

Schools receive £1,300 for each child who is entitled to receive Free School Meals, or who has been entitled in the last 6 years. Looked After Children and children adopted from care are given £1,900.

School can determine how the Pupil Premium is spent as they are best placed to assess what additional provision is needed for individual pupils with their responsibility. School must publish how they spend this money.

Allocation and Use at Marlcliffe Primary School

Our allocation for this year is £109,200.

- To contribute to the funding for a Learning Mentor 12 hours a week to deliver programmes that support pupils' social and emotional needs when they need it. This includes classroom support where necessary. **£8535**
- To contribute to the funding for additional Teaching Assistant hours to deliver intervention programmes to pupils across school that need additional support to catch up with their peers in reading, writing and mathematics. **£18,141**
- To purchase appropriate reading books and resources (e.g. Project X books) for pupils who are less able readers in Key Stage 2. **£5,050**
- TA to provide speech and language support for children in Reception **£3876**
- To pay for individual music tuition for some children. **£630**
- Provide laptop for LAC pupils. **£720**
- Provide places at Dragon's Den Breakfast and After School Club. **£3,990**
- Achievement for All. **£3,000**
- Staff training. **£1,000**
- Subsidise residential visits for pupils on free school meals who might otherwise not have been able to attend. **£1,000**
- To subsidise trips for children on free school meals. **£500**
- Reading Recovery (1-1 3x a week for 30 mins) **£4,000**
- Extra teacher for mornings to reduce class size Y6/Y5 (Pupil Premium and SEN children in groups of 18) **£21,387**
- Extra teacher 1 day a week for booster sessions **£7200**
- Apprentice Y6 to support vulnerable children **£5500**
- Additional Play workers to run lunchtime clubs for vulnerable children **£6300**
- To contribute to the costs of providing 1 to 1 support for ASD child **£6000**
